If your contribution is made from eligible partners or partnerships, please include the names of the partners for our Federal Election Committee reporting requirements. Contributions to the Committee for the Advancement of Cotton ("CAC") are not deductible as charitable contributions for federal income tax purposes. This communication is intended for members of the NCC's "restricted class" only, please do not forward. Contributions to CAC are strictly voluntary, and the contribution guidelines given are only suggestions. You are free to contribute more or less than the guidelines stated; NCC will not favor or disadvantage anyone by reason of the amount of their contribution or their decision not to contribute. The purpose of CAC is political; you have a right to refuse to contribute without reprisal. Federal law requires the PAC to use best efforts to collect and report the name, mailing address, occupation, and employer name of each individual whose contributions exceed \$200 in a calendar year.
