Contributions to CAC are strictly voluntary, and the contribution guidelines given are only suggestions. You are free to contribute more or less than the guidelines stated; NCC will not favor or disadvantage anyone by reason of the amount of their contribution or their decision not to contribute. The purpose of CAC is political; you have a right to refuse to contribute without reprisal. Federal law requires the PAC to use best efforts to collect and report the name, mailing address, occupation, and employer name of each individual whose contributions exceed \$200 in a calendar year.
